- Razor blades

BE CLEAR ABOUT DRAINS

Stick to these rules and you will reduce the chance of blocking your drains. Check out the lists below. One tells you what you CAN put down your drains. The other tells you what you CAN'T. Simple.

What's in?

So what CAN you put down your loo?

It's a short list. And to make it more memorable, each one begins with a 'P':

Pee

Poo Paper

That's it. Nothing more.

Nothing less. Easy.

What's out?

And here's what you CAN'T put down your drains.
Anything else (besides pee, poo and paper) and that includes
Fat, oil and grease
Sanitary products

Cut out the fat

In your drain, fat becomes solid. More fat and debris accumulates and sticks together. We call it a fatberg. And it can create a major blockage. (In 2013, a fatberg the size of a bus was found in one London sewer.) Avoid all that by scraping food waste into the bin and, if necessary, dry-wiping pots with kitchen roll before putting them in the sink or dishwasher.

Tree roots

Trees are the 'root' of many blockages. Once a root finds its way into a drain, the pipe can quickly become blocked completely by a root mass. To reduce the risk of trees damaging and blocking your drains, don't plant near any pipes.

blockages, they cost utility companies and householders £millions every year.
